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Explanation of Transfers by the Department of the Lottery

Transfers to the Common School Fund

The Illinois Department of the Lottery is mandated to make a monthly transfer to the Common School Fund on the last day of each month or shortly thereafter. Currently, the Lottery requests the Illinois Office of the Comptroller to make weekly transfers to the Common School Fund. Each Wednesday, following the sweeps from the lottery retailers accounts, funds are transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Common School Fund.

The amount transferred during any given month is based on the FY'09 actual monthly transfer for the respective month adjusted for inflation. The monthly amount is then broken down to weekly transfer amounts. The rate of inflation used in calculating transfers to the Common School Fund is defined in administrative rules.

If the cash available in the State Lottery fund does not support the planned weekly transfer amount, a transfer is made at an amount affordable and any shortfall is to be made up in future weekly transfers as funds become available.

In March, the Department made 5 weekly transfers of \$13,919,518 for a monthly total of \$69,597,590 to the Common School Fund. At the end of March, the cash balance in the State Lottery Fund was \$185.8M.

Transfer to the Capital Projects Fund

The Illinois Department of the Lottery requests the Illinois Office of the Comptroller to make one annual transfer to the Capital Projects Fund. On or before June 30 of the fiscal year, the Department estimates the net income available after transfers to Common School Fund and specialty ticket funds.

The transfer is made from the State Lottery Fund to the Capital Projects Fund through a non-appropriated line item.

**Report of Revenues, Prize Disbursements and Other Expenses for the
Illinois Department of the Lottery
For the Month Ending March 31, 2016**

The weekly sweeps of Lottery retailers generated \$125,031,081.20 in gross revenues to the State Lottery Fund during the month of March 2016.

The FY'16 transfers to the Common School Fund for the month of March were \$69,597,590. To date, the Lottery has met its statutory scheduled transfers to the CSF in FY'16.

The amount in the Transfers out of 711 for Prize Payments is negative due to the fact that Lottery made a correction for monies previously held at the Multi-State Clearinghouse for Multi-State winners. These monies were recorded as a receipt that should have been processed as an adjustment to the appropriation for prize payments when the monies were returned to the IL Lottery. Overall, this had no effect on cash or to net income. This was just a correction as to how it was recorded.

Lottery will be carrying forward a jackpot reserve balance of \$23.4M into the following month for the Lotto (\$3.25M), Mega Millions (\$50.0M), and Powerball (\$135.0M) jackpots, including reserving the funds (\$27.0M) for the Illinois' grand prize funding for the March 17, 2016 \$27.0M Lotto winner.
